Pharmacist Extended Care Tier 1 Services



- Consultation is free, patients may be asked to purchase OTC products as per NHS guidelines.
- Pharmacists can supply prescription only medications as part of the service where clinically indicated under the terms of a PGD. If patients receive medication it will be free to those who are exempt from prescription charges (including those with a pre-payment certificate) while those who pay for prescriptions will need to pay an NHS Levy.
- The PGDs have strict inclusion and exclusion criteria and where a pharmacist sees a patient and considers that the patient needs treatment but they are excluded, or where they need onward referral the pharmacist will do so.
- Patients should be advised to telephone the pharmacy before attending (especially during the Covid pandemic).
