## **COVID-19 Treatment**



## THE ROLE OF COMMUNITY PHARMACY

The NHS is offering treatments to those people with COVID-19 who are at highest risk of becoming seriously ill.

People are eligible for COVID-19 treatment without being admitted to hospital if all the following apply:

- aged 12 or over
- at **highest risk** of getting seriously ill from COVID-19
- have symptoms of COVID-19
- tested positive for COVID-19

## Access to treatment is now managed by the local health system.

A patient will ring their GP or NHS 111 who will refer them to the COVID-19 Medicines Delivery Unit (CMDU) for assessment. If eligible, **a prescription will be issued for oral antivirals,** which is to be dispensed by a community pharmacy.

## What pharmacy needs to do

- If a patient or their representative attends the pharmacy asking for COVID-19 treatment and they do not present a prescription, ensure to check the NHS spine for an electronic prescription.
- Order stock free of charge from Alliance Healthcare to fulfil the prescription (they have the only distribution agreement with the Department of Health and Social Care). It will be delivered as part of your usual Alliance Healthcare delivery service; same day delivery is available.
