### West Midlands people eligible for free flu vaccine urged to get protected as flu season hits early

## Early flu wave could lead to 'long and drawn out' Winter for NHS

The flu season has hit the NHS more than a month earlier than usual, with cases three times higher than this time last year. The UK Health Security Agency's latest surveillance data shows cases have increased from 6.1% up to 8.2% – largely driven by a spike among school-aged children.
