320,000 people in Staffordshire and Stoke-on-Trent still to take up flu vaccine offer

Has your child missed their annual flu vaccine at school?

Chickenpox added to the routine schedule

Starting 1 January 2026, varicella (chickenpox) will be added to the standard childhood vaccination schedule. Instead of the familiar MMR vaccine (measles, mumps, rubella), children will now be offered

a four-in-one vaccine: measles, mumps, rubella and varicella (chickenpox). Read more on the [GOV.UK website](#).

JCVI influenza update for 2026–27

Nasal spray vaccine provides strong protection

The UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) has [issued a statement](#) advising that early analysis shows the vaccine is providing strong protection for all, with data suggesting the nasal spray vaccine is particularly effective in protecting children from more severe disease.

57% of eligible population are missing out on the free flu jab

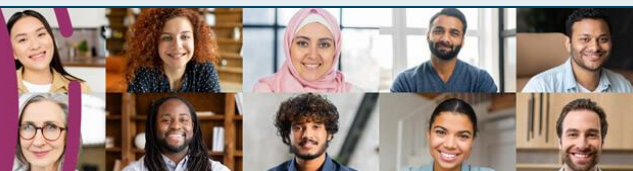
Important reminder for families of at-risk children
